## Projects & Extension Programs

Students in support of Supervisor conducted Awareness program on "Health and Sanitation", "Sexual and Reproductive Health Right" and Panel Discussion on the "Problems and way forward of Kumal Community". The panel discussion was focused from the perspective of women, youth and senior citizens.
